

- * Bachelor of Arts and Science in Environment: Science courses must be in biology, chemistry or physics.
- * Bachelor of Engineering (Transfer): Chemistry and physics are recommended. Calculus and vectors is recommended.
- * Bachelor of Engineering Technology (Electronics and Controls): Physics is recommended.
- * Bachelor of Engineering Technology (Petroleum and Environmental Studies): Physics and chemistry are recommended.
- * Bachelor of Health Sciences (Public Health): Science from biology, geology or physics (physics recommended).
- * Bachelor of Science: For mathematics, calculus and vectors is recommended. Two sciences from biology, chemistry, geology (or environmental science) or physics.
- * Bachelor of Science in Human Nutrition (transfer): Calculus and vectors recommended. Biology and chemistry recommended.
- * Bachelor of Science, Nursing: Two academic courses can be chosen from biology, chemistry or physics. Biology and chemistry are recommended.



Campus Recreation



When we work together and invest in each other, great things happen. That's why we provide more than **\$2.6 million** in scholarships each year, supporting students from their first year through to graduation.

Along with scholarships, CBU also supports students through in-course bursaries and paid work-study programs. While scholarships are awarded to students who have excelled scholastically in high school and are entering post-secondary education for the first time, bursaries are for students who demonstrate financial need.

There are a range of other entrance scholarships from \$500 per year to \$5,000 per year that will also be offered after a review of applicants.

BURSARIES

Cape Breton University provides students with financial needs an opportunity to apply for financial aid through its bursary program.

There are a number of bursaries that students may be eligible for, as well as general bursaries that all students can apply for. In order to be eligible for a bursary, students must:

- Be a registered CBU student
- Complete either an Entrance Bursary Form or In-Course Bursary Form
- Provide income tax assessments for both the student and, in some instances, parents or guardians

Land Acknowledgement

Cape Breton University acknowledges it is located in Unama'ki, one of the seven districts of Mi'kma'ki, the ancestral and unceded territory of the Mi'kmaq people. This territory is covered by the "Treaties of Peace and Friendship" which Mi'kmaq, Wolastoqiyik, and Passamaquoddy People first signed with the British Crown in 1726. The treaties did not deal with the surrender of lands and resources but, in fact, recognized Mi'kmaq and Wolastoqiyik title and established the rules for what was to be an ongoing relationship between nations.
