CBU's Downtown Locations

Cape Breton University is pleased to have expanded our presence into the downtown community while the main campus undergoes construction. During this time, students studying in CBU's Post-Baccalaureate Diploma programs will have an opportunity to temporarily take some of their classes in CBU's downtown classrooms at Cineplex, located in the heart of downtown Sydney! With an office space next door for students to meet with faculty members, student placement officers and their program manager, to the full suite of student support services on-site, students will have everything they need at their fingertips. 500 George Street

CBU Advising Centre

Cape Breton University has a variety of student services available to help you throughout the semester. CBU's Advising Centre (former Learning Commons) is located in the Marvin Harvey Building and is home to Student Development Officers specializing in Academic Advising, Academic Success Coaching, International Student Services, Career Services and the Office for Students of African Descent. Academic Advising

Developing an academic plan and reviewing it over time helps you get the most out of your CBU experience! CBU's Academic Advisors assist students with selecting courses, discussing program requirements and scheduling support. We encourage all new-to-CBU students to complete academic advising. Academic Success Coaching

Academic Success Coaching is available to help students develop the skills they need to achieve their academic goals. Coaches work with students on time management, goal setting and study skills, while offering one-on-one appointments, workshops and a variety of online resources.
